The GiggieIT Project for global student writing empowers your students to share their personal knowledge in creative ways, using your school library as research center and creative writing lab.

GiggieIT can be asynchronous or real-time, online or offline, as required by the needs of your students and their learning plans.

The GiggieIT teaching framework specifically encourages students to:

- develop their oral and written communication skills;
- practice critical information research skills;
- think objectively, critically and creatively about written texts;
- share their personal knowledge in creative ways; and
- work collaboratively in a team environment and independently as a responsible team member.

You can choose from several GiggieIT themes with Spotlight Projects or collaborate with your school librarian to design a project linked to specific curriculum points so your students can creatively share what they know and learn with classmates, family, and community.

GiggieIT was originally designed for students 10-14 and can easily be adapted for younger gifted students, youth with special needs, and English Language Learners of all ages.
